Let's Get *Really* Practical About Praying Part 2

In the last ACORN, I wrote about the incredible privilege of prayer to God, of communing with our Father. Prayer is also *commanded* in Scripture (e. g., Ephesians 6:18 and 1 Thessalonians 5:17). However, I talk to my wife because I *love* her. No command is necessary.

I asked you: Do you have a prayer list? What and how many prayer requests you will pray about each time? Who and what is on your list?

May I ask you two more questions?

Question #4 Do you keep up with those for whom you pray, what is important to them, their personal, family needs? "How did the operation go?" "Was that problem resolved?" Some prayer requests are very temporary. Knowing significant needs, problems, gets us involved in lives and our prayers are more serious. Do you continually revise your list of requests?

Question #5 When do you pray? I know life gets hectic, overfull sometimes with working on your marriage, guiding your children, going to work every day, keeping the house in order—and more. Have you, or you and your spouse, settled on regular times, made these times a habit, a habit that you would not miss—except, of course, for conflicts? ("Life is inseparable from conflict." This is one of my favorite quotes from a Christian psychiatrist. Often, silently, I would say these words—especially when our sons were teenagers.) Times that become as sure as going to bed, brushing your teeth, as saying "I love you" to those you love.

We have found that in addition to praying together at another time of the day, praying (and kissing and just talking—but I digress) very briefly before we go to sleep



at night is a great and wonderful practice. It is like a daily, day-ending injection of worship, joy, conversation with God, showing love to one another. (I confess, as one saved sinner to another, that I began this practice when Kathleen was very ill. *You* could begin now, before someone gets ill.)



Because of a limited cash flow to purchase low-grade oil from Venezuela, electrical shortages have become a common place in Cuba. People are very discouraged, and want the freedom to find another place to live.

Continue to pray for Cuba. I leave for Cuba on another ministry trip on September 2. Pray for funds for this journey.

Ann was recently in Medellin, Colombia attending a conference on how to evaluate evangelical seminaries in the Hispanic world. She and three other colleagues have been greatly enriched with wise counsel in how to apply this knowledge in order that our seminary's ministry in Guatemala will be enhanced.

Financial Update

Oakwood finances. You may have noticed the recent financial updates in our Worship Program and we want to provide you with some additional information. YTD offerings are about \$54K under our YTD expenses.

This was somewhat anticipated because until the end of June we had been paying two pastors.

The balance in our operating account has been declining and based on our current trend we decided to redirect some funds from our equity accounts in order to cover July's expenses. The Elders and Deacons agreed to move \$10k from a dormant emergency medical account set aside for the Phairs into our operating account.

An additional measure has been taken by the Missions Team to reduce financial support to our missionaries by 15% effective September 1st.



Food Bag Ministry


