# From The Interim's Desk...What's Happening?

"What is the Transition Team doing at this point in preparation for our next Pastor?" The team, made up of one Elder (Rob Weyand), two Deacons (David Conner & Mike Wyatt), three men members (Brad Gordon, Arnie Mejias, & Luke Piazza), and three women members (Val Brand, Andrea Cress, & Julie Minardi), along with four alternates (Thomas Adams, Joe Angelo, Katie Frost, & Arlene Williams) have functioned well with humility, passion, and relational skill.

<u>Humility</u>: The team has listened well to the church family through the assessment tools. Additionally, they have never once planted their flags so deeply on any issue that they stopped effectively listening to the wisdom that each has brought to the process. They have formulated suggestions for the Elders to consider in key areas that need to be strengthened in the body.

<u>Passion</u>: The Transition Team has enthusiastically approached their responsibility to the point that, apart from surgery, illness, or death in the family, no one has missed any of the bi-monthly meetings. They are so passionate about doing the work that they enthusiastically labor to move us toward our next Lead Pastor.

**Relational** Skill: Without exception, they have encouraged each other, valued each other's wisdom, and lovingly challenged each other's perspectives. Not once has anyone felt unappreciated or not needed on the team. They know how to "speak the truth in love" (Ep. 4:15).

But, what has been accomplished?

1] **Thorough Assessment of the Health of OCC**: The key areas to strengthen identified through interaction with the entire church are: **Church Structure**, which includes, but is not limited to, how the work of Christ gets done by the body. Church ministry leaders have been unclear on who they can turn to in leadership for support, help, and resources to accomplish their work. Evaluation of ministries is less than a priority. **Empowering Leadership**, which in-



cludes, but is not limited to, how to begin new ministry(ies) consistent with the mission and process of the church. People have anticipated that suggestions given to the Elders should be implemented without thought of who is gifted to lead and serve in those suggested ministries or how they would be resourced and evaluated. **Inspiring Worship**, which includes, but is not limited to, study of the Word of God, participatory worship music, testimonies, prayer, and other elements of worship.



## Lifeline Screening

Oakwood Community Church is pleased to offer a preventive health event. Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will host their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings on Saturday, February 11, 2017. 2] Well Thought-Out Suggestions to Improve the Weak Areas: Church Structure: The Transition Team has submitted to the Elders a flow chart that attempts to reflect the Biblical role of Elders, Deacons, and Members of OCC. The chart encourages communication from the inside out and from the outside in. Roles are structured in such a way on the chart as to clearly communicate which church leader a ministry director can approach for counsel, encouragement, and resources. Additionally, the TT has submitted to the Elders a plan for establishing an approach to evaluate all current church ministries. Empowering Leadership: The TT has also submitted to the Elders a procedure and checklist for new ministries and ideas that issue from the body for new approaches to accomplishing the mission of OCC. It places on the shoulders of Elders the privilege of encouraging helping, and resourcing members to be responsible for new ministries that they are gifted and passionate to start. Inspiring Worship: One of the key recommendations from the TT to the Elders is to prayerfully consider a volunteer leadership role to coordinate the incorporation of God-stories (testimonies), systematic ministry highlights, and prayer for missionaries to regularly celebrate what God is doing through OCC. Elders will be completing their evaluation of the suggestions in a timely manner and presenting them to the Church Family.

But, what's going on now?

**January**: The TT is putting together profiles in preparation for beginning the search for our next Servant Leader. They include a Pastoral Profile, a Church Profile, and a Community Profile. The church and community profiles are simply statements of facts about OCC's history and current life in the Carrollwood and Tampa area. The Pastoral Profile will include character traits and skill sets necessary to strengthen the areas of needed (listed above).

**February**: There will be some coaching of the Transition Team, as it becomes the Pastoral Search Team. Glen Schreiber, the District Superintendent of the Evangelical Free Church of America, to which OCC belongs, will lead a training session on February 15<sup>th</sup> to help equip the Search Team. We anticipate being ready to post for the search by early spring. The post for the position will be made through Ministry Connection (a service provided by the EFCA), through selected colleges/seminaries (alumni who are in ministry frequently contact their alma maters), and if that does not yield quality candidates, we will cast the net farther by posting on broader websites.

What else?

**Leadership Development**: About 15 men consistently met through the fall to study what the Word says about leadership. The Elders have invited two men to attend Elder meetings for a three-month period as Interns for practical exposure to Shepherding. It is anticipated that two more will be given the same opportunity every three months without any commitment on their part to become Elders.

It is anticipated that our next Lead Pastor will want to continue Leadership Development.
