Review

Idols:

- o 3. Destroy (v. 40)

The One True God:

- 1. Speaks the Truth (v. 1; 24; 36-37)
- o 2. Saves (v. 38-39)
- o 3. Satisfies (v. 45; 19:4-6, 11-12)

Worship Must Be:

- o 1. Focused on the One True God (John 4:24) whose name is Jesus (Acts 17:30-31)
- 2. From an Undivided Heart (Matt. 22:37)

An idol is whatever you look at and say, in your heart of hearts, 'If I have that, then I'll feel my life has meaning, then I 'll know I have value, then I'll feel significant and secure.'
