What's Your Bullseye?

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:10

As we process our Missions Conference and consider how the Lord wants to use us both locally and globally, let's believe the truth of Ephesians 2:10. God has created each of us with a unique calling. If you think of God's will for your life as a bull-seye, the center of the target involves PEOPLE and the next ring involves PRO-JECTS.

Our primary purpose in life is to make a difference in the lives of people. If you

are married, your top priority is your spouse. If you have children, they are the center of your target. Jesus clearly commissioned all of his followers to "make disciples of all nations," (Matt. 28:19-20) so this is our first calling – to reach people with the gospel and help them become fully devoted followers of Jesus.

cided **exactly when** they should live. And he decided **exactly where** they should live. God did this so that people would seek him." Acts 17:26-27 NIrV

Each of us has been positioned by God so that specific people will have the opportunity to hear the gospel. Are we hitting the bullseye by reaching those closest to us with the good news of Jesus?

The next ring involves projects – specific work God has designed us and called us to do. We are to be both salt and light – not just speaking the truth of the gospel but bringing the love of Jesus into the world in practical ways. This ring involves *your vocation* – the line of work God lined up for you in a career path. And it also involves *your volunteering* – the extra tasks and programs you are gifted and equipped to engage in.

To say it another way, the center of the bullseye involves sharing the *Good News* and the next ring involves performing *Good Deeds*. These two callings will often go hand in hand as "good deeds create good will so people can hear the good news" (Eric Swanson).

OPEN a one-year journey through the Bible

As Pastor Darin continues his message series and our journey through the Bible in 2019, remember that there are a number of resources available to enhance your journey. Below is a glimpse of our journey through the month of March.

Week 17

Sin—God calls us to godliness and righteousness. We are to love God with our whole heart and we are to love our neighbors as ourselves. Morality cannot be sustained when we lose the knowledge of God. But when we come to Jesus Christ, He will reconcile us to the Father and lead us in paths of righteousness.

Week 18

Righteousness—Righteousness cannot be imposed by parents, churches, or governments because it must flow from the heart. Of course, good laws are better than bad ones, and they have great value in restraining evil. Good laws backed up by appropriate penalties will usually bring some modification of behavior. But the law cannot bring a change of heart, and that is why attempts to impose religion always fail.

God's purpose is not to impose an outward conformity to His law. It is to cultivate an inward desire for righteousness. This is the promise of the new covenant and the work of the Holy Spirit. It involves changing our hearts to give us a new hunger for righteousness, and a new ability to pursue a life that is pleasing to God.

Week 19

Joy—Scripture has the power to change a human life and reshape an entire community. When God's Word is taught, God's voice is heard. The Bible read and applied will expose our sins and reveal God's grace. When this leads to repentance and obedience, you will experience great joy.

Week 20

Holiness—God is holy, holy, holy. His holiness is foundational to His character. In Isaiah's day thousands of people crowded into the temple, but they had no experience of the God they claimed to worship. Eventually this kind of worship becomes boring. But if you think God is boring, you have never encountered the God of the Bible.

Sin is an offense against a holy God, and an atonement is needed, because without it sinners would be ruined in His presence. The good news of the gospel is that Jesus, God's Son, satisfied the judgment of a holy God, by becoming the sacrifice that atoned for all our sins.

Christians desperately need to rediscover the awesome holiness of God. Then, like Isaiah, we will begin to appreciate the wonder of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ, and we will feel that our greatest privilege in life is to serve this awesome, glorious, holy God.



How can you hit the bullseye this year? Pray about this in your small group and you may be surprised to find that others have a similar calling and you can multiply your impact by serving and reaching out together!

At the center of your bullseye are your *family relationships*. Start with your immediate family and then consider the members of your extended family. That is the inner circle of your target.

The next ring includes your *neighbors and the nations*. All of us are called to love and reach out to the people closest to us in terms of where we live, work and play. And we have been sent to make disciples of all nations – so all Christians share the responsibility to support the spread of the gospel to the ends of the earth. For some this means relocating to a place that needs a greater gospel witness. *For all of us it means intentional prayer, sacrificial giving and compassionate outreach where we are.*

"Whatever you do, do it well for the glory of God, and do it some place strategic for the kingdom." J.D. Greear, *Gaining by Losing*

Increasingly it is not traditional missionaries that are most needed to bring the gospel to the remaining unreached people groups, as these areas tend to be closed to overt religious influence. So the most useful gospel workers who can enter these otherwise closed countries are business people who can ply their trade in places like the Middle East or southeast Asia, seeking to share Christ with their new associates, neighbors and friends.

People should be our top priority. Projects will often supplement our relational outreach. *Good deeds can pave the way for the good news*. The work God has prepared for each of us to do involves both our vocational path and our volunteer efforts. If God has gifted you in business, make as much money as you can to give away as much as you can. If God has made you a "people person," leverage your relationships for kingdom impact. If God has given you a sharp mind, use it to share your knowledge with others. If God designed you to work with your hands, devote yourself to works of service to touch the lives of people.
