Three godly responses when the wicked win:

- 1. **Trust** in the Lord. (v.1-11)
 - a. Trusting in the Lord means putting off anxiety, envy, and anger.
 - b. Trusting in the Lord means putting on **patience** and **meekness**.
- 2. Be **content** in the Lord. (v.12-26)
 - a. Be content that the Lord will **judge**. (v.12-15)
 - b. Be content that the Lord will **provide**. (v.16-26)
- 3. Do **good** for the Lord. (v.27-40)
 - a. God always **strengthens** the righteous. (v.27-39)
 - b. God always **restores** the righteous. (v.40)
